From the desk of Vicar Ann Bjorklund

Lent is considered a time of self-denial. We often give up certain things that we might really enjoy or might be addicted to in some way or another. As I'm thinking of this, I'm trying to look at it a little differently. What would it mean if we looked at this time of self-denial and preparation for the death and resurrection of Jesus as a way that we might focus on others a bit more? Many of us know the story of the "Good Samaritan" and how people passed by on the opposite side of the road, but that the Samaritan, someone who is generally at odds with the Jews, was the one to help, regardless of the cost and the possible repercussions that might come his way as he broke with what seemed to be culturally acceptable at the time.

What would it look like if we did a bit more to look out for our neighbor? Some of you personally know your neighbors. They may be good friends, acquaintances, someone you know by face, someone you know by name but have never met, or even someone that you don't know by name or face. All of those around us are our neighbors. I would venture to guess that most of you do not harbor ill wishes for your neighbor. So, how can we be mindful of loving and caring for our neighbors? What does that look like in our congregation and our community?

The mission statement of Faith Lutheran Church is:

"Moving Forward in Faith by Providing Spiritual and Physical Nourishment for All God's People"

Helping your neighbor might mean giving of your time, talents, or money to support the mission that you as a congregation have chosen. There are many opportunities for you to serve your neighbors through the ministries of Faith, whether it involves reading as a lector, serving on a committee or board, sponsoring youth on the Jesus Trip, contributing to the general budget, serving as a Sunday School teacher, helping put quilts together, helping in the kitchen, assisting Faith Builders, and the list goes on.

You can also care for your neighbor locally. Have you considered what it means to purchase good and services locally rather than at some of the big box stores? You're supporting your local economy. The business owner, the employees, the people that are your next-door neighbors, your friends down the street, those across town, or those out in the country. Your local business owners don't generally have the tremendous buying power that the large stores have, but they might be the ones that open their store for you because you have a broken tractor part, you need a tow, or there's some other challenge that has come up. How can you love and support your neighbor?

Our OPERATION STARFISH mission kicks off this year on Ash Wednesday which is February 26. We are praying that God stirs our hearts to open our minds and our pocketbooks to give monetary support towards building a

double home for a very needy family in Haiti. Why Haiti? It is the poorest country in the world. They need our help! Our theme for our mission is "40 days of change (as in cash) for CHANGE (as in life changing gift). "We build our homes through Food for the Poor. This organization has been building homes and supplying food for destitute families in the Caribbe-

an for years. Our faith family can raise the \$3,800 needed and with the Food for the Poor matching gift of \$3,800, we will meet the cost to build a deserving family a safe, new home for \$7,600. Once the home is built and the key given to a family, our congregation will receive a fulfillment package with a picture of the home that was built and the family that is given the home! Please check out the wall of pictures across from Vicar Ann's office to see the beautiful families and their new homes that our congregation facilitated building through Food for the Poor over the years! Global Missions will have some collection boxes around the church and as always, a check written to Faith Lutheran with Operation Starfish on the memo line, will always work! This mission will run through Easter Sunday. So PLEASE talk to God about this and see what you are able to give towards this most worthy cause.

In Minnesota, the month of March has become known as "Minnesota Food Share Month". What exactly does this mean? It means that we intentionally focus on filling up our beautiful states food shelves to help other Minnesotans that have food insecurities. We will again focus on this the month of March here at Faith. All month long, you can bring your food donations to the grocery cart in the Narthex and we will get these donations to our local food shelf.
